“Spending a Day with Master Clinicians”**

They will share their clinical reasoning based on experience and best evidence in prioritizing the elements of the examination process, developing a clinical physical therapy diagnosis and prognosis, choosing appropriate interventions, and assessing treatment outcome. The program will include presentation of three cases with ample time for discussion between the presenters and the audience, and may include demonstration and practice of techniques. Claire is also a certified instructor for Janda's Approach to Musculoskeletal Pain Syndromes, and Kolar's Approach to Dynamic Neuromuscular Stabilization.
